**Dr. Talha Riaz**, Clinical Assistant Professor Medicine, and Orthopedic Surgery, earned his medical degree from the King Edward Medical College, Pakistan followed by residency in Internal Medicine at the Cleveland Clinic, Ohio. He completed his Infectious Diseases fellowship at the Medical University of South Carolina (MUSC). He also completed a fellowship in Orthopedics infectious diseases at the Mayo Clinic, MN and a research fellowship in Cardiovascular Infectious Diseases at Mayo Clinic, MN. He has worked under the mentorship of national leaders in Orthopedic ID including Drs. Douglas Osmon, Elie Berbari and Camelia Marculescu. He has worked on multiple projects pertaining to osteoarticular infections including a multi-center research study that focused on the risk factors of fungal prosthetic joint infections.

He is currently working on several projects related to orthopedic infections and collaborates with the orthopedic surgeons at the University of Arizona. He is also fascinated by coccidioidomycosis involving the bone and is an active member of the Valley Fever Center of Excellence.
